## Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) Nunavik Launches Community Tour - March 2025

**Kuujuaq, March 2025** – The Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) Nunavik program is launching a community tour at the end of March to connect with beneficiaries and share information. This initiative is a part of our communication strategy and supports our top priority: improving access to essential health services for Nunavimmiut. Each community will be notified in advance through Facebook posts and announcements on their local FM radio station.

### About NIHB Nunavik

The **Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB) Nunavik program** provides eligible beneficiaries with coverage for essential health services that are not included in other social programs, private insurance plans, or the Quebec health insurance system. All Quebec residents, including Nunavik beneficiaries under the **James Bay and Northern Quebec Agreement (JBNQA)**, have access to provincial health programs, while NIHB ensures additional coverage tailored to the needs of Inuit communities.
