

Food Recall in Canada – Quaker and Cap’n Crunch Cereals and Granola Bars

Kuujuuaq, January 15th, 2024 – Health Canada issued a food recall due to possible presence of Salmonella bacteria in some granola bars and cereals.

Products at risk are :

Cap’n Crunch Treats Bars, Berry – All best before dates from January 11th to July 9th, 2024
Quaker Harvest Crunch cereals – All best before dates from January 11th to July 9th, 2024
Quaker Chewy – All best before dates from January 11th to September 7th, 2024
Quaker Dipps – All best before dates from January 11th to October 7th, 2024
Quaker Yogurt – All best before dates from January 11th to October 7th, 2024

Groceries and other point of sales must remove these products from shelves. If you have these products at home, do not consume these products. Throw them out.
If you have consumed any of these products in the past few weeks and feel unwell, contact your CLSC/Nursing Station.
