





Travel into Nunavik is currently limited according to the Ministerial Order 2021-023:

Any persons authorized to travel to Nunavik, must follow public health measures related to travels such as pre-departure testing, testing at day 7 and a 14-day quarantine period:

Only limited categories of travelers are authorised for entry into Nunavik.

People visiting for leisure i.e., tourists are currently not allowed access to Nunavik.

Nunavik outfitters can operate in the region; however, travel restrictions and public health measures are strictly respected.

People taking part in tourist activities must come from within Nunavik or be in Nunavik for other authorized reasons.

Changes to the public health measures and the restrictions of travels may happen in the coming months.

However, at this time the evolution of the epidemiology inside and outside the region is unpredictable due to new variants and the third wave of COVID-19. Decisions regarding travels would be guided by the epidemiology but also new scientific evidence regarding vaccination and COVID-19 transmission.

If changes were to happen to allow tourists to travel in Nunavik, please note that **public health measures** would still apply (including a 14-day quarantine).
